FRONTY-FORDS ENTERED IN UNIONTOWN RACE

UNIONTOWN, Pa., June 14.—Two Fords are entered in the 225-mile Universal Trophy race to be run at the Uniontown Speedway Saturday afternoon. It's true that there is considerable change made over the car as it is produced by a certain Michigan manufacturer of note, these two entries being Fronty-Fords and entered by Louis Chevrolet and his brother, Arthur Chevrolet.

These Ford cars are the first ever entered in the International Sweepstakes at Indianapolis and the first to be entered in a big event at the Uniontown track. The Fronty-Fords are regular Ford chassis equipped with Frontenac cylinder head and other racing specialties.

"Just wait until you see them," wired Louis Chevrolet when asked details concerning these entries. He wired if the entries would be acceptable and he was quickly notified that there were no objections if the entries qualified as to piston displacement and qualification speed.

"That's a minor matter," wired back this veteran of the racing game, now head of the Chevrolet Brothers' Manufacturing Company and designer and manufacturer of the Frontenac car, which many times has won Uniontown events. The Fronty-Fords qualify as to piston displacement and you just watch them run if you have any misgivings about them qualifying for that 225-mile race at your Speedway on the seventeenth.

The entries were accepted and are on file. The Fronty-Fords, Chevrolet announced, were shipped immediately from Indianapolis and are expected to make their first appearance on the Uniontown track on Wednesday afternoon. Jack Curtner and C. Glenn Howard have been named as the drivers of the two Fronty-Fords.
