RACE TROPHY IS PRESENTED

200 Attend Borg Warner
Dinner—Old-Time Drivers Honored Guests.

An interesting sidelight to the 500mile Indianapolis Motor Speedway race was an informal dinner given by the Borg Warner Company in the ballroom of the Indianapolis Athletic Club last night.
