

COOPER CHANGES TIRE IN 12 SECONDS FLAT

BEATS DISBROW RECORD OF 14 SECONDS AT STATE FAIR RACES IN MILWAUKEE YESTERDAY; COOPER COPS FIRST HONORS.

MILWAUKEE, Wis., Sept. 14.—A new world's record for a complete wheel change was established at the state fair on Friday afternoon when a new tire and wheel was placed on Earl Cooper's machine in twelve seconds flat after he had raced a mile with Louis Disbrow, and after the change completed another lap. Cooper won the event.

Cliff Woodbury won the three mile event, defeating Wonderlich and D'Allen. He drove a Duesenberg and negotiated the distance in 2 minutes and 57 seconds. Wonderlich finished second and D'Allen third.

The "battle of champions" event of five miles distance, was won by Cooper in a Stutz in 4 minutes and 27 seconds. Gaston Chevrolet finished in second place. Louis Disbrow, the other entrant, was compelled to drop out due to engine trouble.

Disbrow captured top honors in the handicap pursuit race, defeating Cooper by a few feet. The object of the race was to overtake the other drivers, which compelled them to drop out. Wonderlich and Woodbury were overtaken.

Chevrolet, in a Sunbeam, romped off with the five mile contest with Woodbury second, Wonderlich third and D'Allen fourth. The time was 4 minutes and 34 seconds.

In the twenty-five mile classic, the feature event on Friday's program, Cooper and Disbrow staged a thrilling race, the latter winning by a few inches. Woodbury in a Duesenberg finished third while Wonderlich was fourth. The time was 23.22.

A fast track greeted the speed artists. There was a terrible amount of dust raised, which annoyed the thousands of spectators.
