

MIDGET AUTO RACES SCHEDULED TONIGHT

Sixteen drivers and twelve cars have been entered in the first of a weekly series of midget automobile races to be staged at the fairgrounds Coliseum tonight. These high-powered speedsters will be piloted by several nationally famous drivers, with ten events on the program. The races start at 8 o'clock.

Four of the events call for six-lap races, four for ten laps, a picked match race for the three fastest cars on the track and a twenty-five-lap finale. The latter race will be composed of the winners of first and second positions in the preliminaries.

The drivers are Frank Brisko, Louis Schneider, Harry McQuinn, Tony Willman, Jimmy Snyder, Ronny Householder, Pat Warren, Harry Lewis, Ted Hartley, Marshall Lewis, Harold Shaw, Tudy Marchese, Wally Mitchell, Carl Marchese, R. Hough and Wally Zale.

Speaking System Installed.

The speaking system has been installed and is all in readiness for Ed Steinboch, better known as "Twenty Grand," when he steps up to the mike, to let the fans know the ins and outs of this new racing game. "Twenty Grand" is an old hand at the driving game, himself, and nothing that entertains the crowds gets past him. Every driver and every doodad on every one of these tiny speeders is well known to him.

To facilitate accurate timing and fairness to every participant a photo-electric eye that times to the 100th of a second has been installed and H. A. Fosdick, the Chicago designer and builder of the device, will come to the Coliseum to personally supervise its operation at this opening race.

Art Chevrolet, well known in Indianapolis for his many years of automobile manufacture, will be in charge of the technical details.

One of these midgets, car No. 15, to be driven by Pat Warren of Chicago, is owned by H. A. Mannix, operator of an Indianapolis automotive service company. This car holds the twenty-five-lap track record at Chicago and all the track records of the course in St. Louis. The power plant of the car is a 4-60 Elto out-board motor.
