Mr. Glenn L. Martin is at present in Europe, and the garage of the Company has done a few adjustments on Mr. Martin's Stutz Coupe, and I just tested it for them.

Since we replaced the intake manifold, which was leaking, the motor performs O.K., but the transmission of this car is the noisiest one I have ever sat behind, and I know that Mr. Martin has passed the remark several times that he did not like that transmission on account of its noise when the car was new, but was hoping that it would quiet down after a few thousand miles, but it is just the other way.

The car has just a few miles less than 7,000 miles, and if you could do anything in regard to that transmission, or replace it by a quiet one, I know Mr. Martin will appreciate it.
