COMPANY NAME CHANGED

Chevrolet Firm to Produce Series of Aircraft Motors.

Arthur Chevrolet, president of

Chevrolet Brothers Manufacturing Company, 410 West Tenth street, has announced change of the company's name to Chevrolet Aviation Motors Corporation and plans to engineer for quality production a new series of aircraft motors of four, six and eight-

cylinder, air-cooled design.

Products of the corporation will be known as "Chevrol-air" motors. A four-cylinder motor will be built to develop sixty to seventy-horse power. A six-cylinder motor will develop 125 to 150-horse power and an eight-cylinder motor will be manufactured to develop 180 to 200-horse power. One of the four-cylinder motors, built for the Moundsville (W. Va.) Airplane Corporation, has been in test flight for 200 hours.

The new corporation, to be capitalized at \$1,000,000, will have Gordon S. Griffin and Byron P. Prunk as vice-presidents. Otta A. Kuehrmann will be secretary-treasurer. Louis Chevrolet, formerly associated with Arthur Chevrolet in Chevrolet Brothers Manufacturing Company, incorporated the Chevrolet Aircraft Corporation in May and also is engineering a new type airplane motor.
