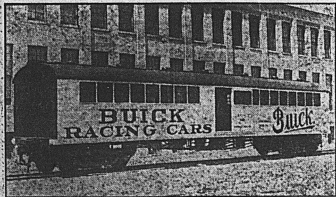


Special Car For Transportation of Buick Racing Machines and Drivers.



During the last three weeks there has been standing on a sidetrack at the Buick automobile plant an Arms stock express car, undergoing the process of being converted into a special car for the transportation of the members of the Buick racing team and their racing machines to different points throughout the United States where big racing meets have been scheduled for the coming summer and fall. The preparation of the car, while not as yet completed, has advanced to a point where it lacks only the installation of the interior equipment of racks for the racing machines and bunks for the expert and daring drivers who will pilot them in the coming racing events. This part of the work of preparing the car for service will take only a short time and will be done at Jackson, while the racing machines to be taken aboard are being put through the finishing process in that city during the next

week or ten days.

The car will leave for Jackson over the Grand Trunk this afternoon or tomorrow, with Louis Chevrolet and George Dewitt, of the Buick racing team, as passengers. Robert Burman, accompanied by his mechanic, Griffin, is driving through to that city today in his racing car, and will remain there until the transportation car is ready to begin its travels. Lewis Strang, also of the racing team, left this afternoon for New York, and from there he will go to Jackson to join the other members of the team.

In its travels over the country the transportation car, which is painted in light gray, will be attached to passenger trains. Its first stop after leaving Jackson will be at Chicago, where the members of the Buick racing team will participate in the Big Cobe and Indiana trophy events on the Lowell track, near that city, on June 17 and 18.
