

Star Entered in Funk Speedway Races Today

WINCHESTER, Ind., July 23.—Some of the best half-mile track racing ever seen in the middle West is expected at Funk's speedway tomorrow afternoon, when a series of four short races will be held. George Souders, winner of the Indianapolis 500-mile race, will be one of the participants. George is a newcomer on the local banked course, while Wilbur Shaw of Indianapolis, Louis Schneider of Indianapolis, Shorty Cantlon of Detroit, Bruce Miller of Detroit and Dutch Baumann, also of Indianapolis, know the course almost blindfolded.

Sixteen entries have been received for the four events. These events will be for five, ten, fifteen and twenty miles.

The Funk track is running under American Automobile Association auspices this year. The track has been put in good shape and previous oilings, together with a good oiling this week, have put it in almost dustless shape.

The first race will be held at 2:30 o'clock, but the elimination trials will begin at 12 o'clock, the number of entries making this necessary.

Souders will use the same Duesenberg with which he won at Indianapolis. Dutch Baumann will drive a Fronty-Ford for Arthur Chevrolet.
