## HIGHWAYMAN AT GLEN COVE.

Arthur Chevrolet, J. Roger Maxwell's Chauffeur, Attacked and Robbed of \$120-One Arrest Made.

Glen Cove, L. I., October 11—Arthur Chevrolet, chauffeur for J. Rogers Maxwell, was the victim of a highway robbery early this morning. He was passing along School street about 4 o'clock when one of the automombile tires received a puncture, and he was bending over the wheel, fixing it, when he was struck on the back of the head and knocked down. His assailant then went through his pockets, relieving him of \$120.

As soon as Chevrolet recovered he started in pursuit and called to Night Watchman Van Wagner to stop the man, who was fleeing down the street. The watchman called to him to stop, but did not shoot, and the thief kept on running. He passed down by the ice plant and got away.

The robbery occurred in the heart of the village, and the night watchman is being severely criticised for letting the man get away.

Officers Lamb and Zoeller this morning arrested at the landing a man of the name of Lambert, locally known as "Frenchy," on suspicion. They claim to be warranted in making the arrest and have placed Lambert in the lockup pending the return of Justice Cocks, who is out of town. He will be arraigned to-night.
