ALL-INDIANA ENTRIES IN WEST COAST ROAD RACE

LOS ANGELES, November 14.—
Indiana will have at least two allIndiana combinations in the first annual Ascot gold cup road race near
Los Angeles Thanksgiving day. One
will be Ralph Ormsby, of Ft. Wayne,
one of the best dirt track drivers
that ever swung a racing car around
the half-mile dirt circuits, and a
Fronty-Ford, entered by Arthur
Chevrolet, of Indianapolis. Not only
is Arthur the entrant, but he built
the car that will carry his hopes of
the fat first place prize in the race.
Chance Kinsley, of Indianapolis,
driving a 183-inch Frontenac, is another all-Indiana entry.

There will be six or seven other Fronty-Fords in the race. One will be the same Barber-Warnock Special that A. E. Moss, the English driver, drove in the recent 500. Its driver will be Floyd Shawhan, of Dayton, O. Shawhan is the owner of the car. Another will be a Fronty-Ford owned and driven by Harry

Nickols, of Chicago.

Ormsby has had his mount at the Ascot track for several weeks, having recently won a ten-lap race on the Ascot five-eighths-of-a-mile track in 5:30 2-5, said to be a record on that dirt course for the distance.
