

SCHEEL MOTORS CO. ENTERS RACING GAME

The Scheel Motors Co., having developed and perfected during the last year and a half the Scheel rotary valve four engine, has made arrangements with Louis Chevrolet of Indianapolis, the famous race driver and designer and builder of the Frontenac racing cars, to design and build three new racing cars, to be powered with Scheel rotary valve engines and to be known as the Scheel-Frontenac cars. These cars will be entered in the International Sweepstakes race at Indianapolis, Decoration day, 1923.

Arrangements for the using of the Scheel motor in the Frontenac cars at the Indianapolis races next Decoration day were made several weeks ago, while Chevrolet was a visitor in St. Louis. According to John A. Schroeder, vice president and general manager of the Scheel Motors Co., the new Scheel rotary valve four-cylinder motor eliminates various valve parts that are necessary in other type motors, as well as valve adjustments and valve noises and grinding.

Schroeder stated that he believes that in the comparatively near future the rotary valve engine will be universally used in automobiles, trucks, tractors, airplanes and motorboats.
