GREENVILLE PLANS JULY 5 RACE MEET

Special "Dutch" Baumann Championship Cup at Stake.

Greenville, O., June 26—An auto racing program second only to the yearly Indianapolis 500-mile event, was announced here today for Sunday July 5, by the Greenville Motor Speedway. Fifty of the world's most daring dirt track drivers will compete in a series of races on this date at the local racing plane for a combined purse of \$2650, the largest prize ever offered for dirt track events. The winner will receive in addition to the "pot of gold" the beautiful "Dutch" Bauman Memorial clip emblematic of the dirt track speed championship.

Special arrangements have been made to accommodate 25,000 people for this event.

Seven races will make up the program which will offer more than six hours of thrilling excitement. It is estimated that competing cars will represent an investment of almost a quarter of a million dollars. World's leading engineers and individuals are already building special cars for the occasion among whom is Arthur Chevrolet of the celebrated Chevrolet brothers, who will place his latest engineering feat into competition for this rich prize.

With the record purse and rich prizes for new track and world's record to shoot at the drivers will no doubt send their "iron-horses" around the track at a speed that will leave the spectators gasping for breath. The races should present the greatest spectacle ever witnessed on an auto race course outside the Indianapolis speedway.

The management announces that every precaution for the safety and convenience of the fans will be provided. There will be no raise in admission prices, general admission remaining at seventy-five cents and reserved seats seventy-five cents additional.
