

HEARNE IN BALLOT WINS 15-MILE RACE

The special fifteen-mile race held at the Indianapolis Motor Speed way yesterday afternoon in honor of the visiting delegates attending the Second district convention of B'nai B'rith was won by Eddie Hearne in a French Ballot. Art Klein, driving a Frontenac, was second and Ralph Mulford, in a Frontenac, was third. Wilbur D'Alene's Monroe was fourth, and Glenn Howard's Fronty-Ford finished fifth. The position of the cars for the six laps was as follows:

The race of six laps was from a standing start and the time of the winner was 10:26.67 which figures approximately eighty six and one half miles per hour. The fastest lap was the second which was won by Klein who was clocked at 1:38.85 which figures about ninety one and one half miles per hour.

The three leaders were well bunched throughout the race. Hearne winning the final lap by less than two car lengths over Klein who was less than a car length ahead of Mulford. When the machines went under the wire at half distance a blanket would have covered the three leaders.
