## PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION

To the Honorable the Superior Court of Marion County at Ind'pls Ind.  
 The petition of Arthur Emile Chervolet hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:  
 First. My place of residence is 4327 Central Ave - Ind'pls Ind  
 Second. My occupation is Automobile  
 Third. I was born on the 21 day of Apr. anno Domini 1884 at Basel - Switzerland  
 Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Havre - France on or about the 18 day of May  
 anno Domini 1902 and arrived in the United States, at the port of New York, on the 23 day of May  
 anno Domini 1902 on the vessel Harvey  
 Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 23 day of Apr. anno Domini 1919  
 at Ind'pls Ind. in the Marion Circuit Court of Indiana  
 Sixth. I am not married. My wife's name is Anna; she was born on the 1 day of Mar anno Domini 1883  
 at Scotland and now resides at 4327 Central Ave, Ind'pls Ind.  
 I have 2 children, and the name, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to The Swiss Confederation of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 23 day of May anno Domini 1902, and in the State of Indiana continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the Feb day of Feb anno Domini 1915, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court.
