Finding in Chevrolet's Case to Be Made Aug. 9

After hearing evidence in the case of Arthur Chevrolet, 49 years old, 2909 East Riverside drive, who was charged with assault and battery as the result of an automobile accident last week, Dewey Myers, judge protem in Municipal court, yesterday announced that he would make his finding Aug. 9.

Chevrolet was alleged to have struck Fred Frieje, 20 years old, and his mother, Mrs. Rebecca Frieje, 4102 Cornelius avenue, with a wire cable in an altercation which followed collision of Chevrolet's car

with one driven by Frieje.

Chevrolet testified that Frieje called him names and then obtained a baseball bat from his automobile and approached him. He also testified that he did not strike Mrs. Frieje, but struck her son with a piece of electric light wire and took the ball bat from him.

Chevrolet said that he collided with the rear of Frieje's automobile on North Meridian street when he was unable to stop quickly enough. He also testified that Frieje was driving slowly on Meridian street and that he made repeated efforts to pass his car, but was unable to do so.

Louis Schneider, race driver, testified that he was following Chevrolet home in another automobile and he coroborated Chevrolet's story.
