

CHEVROLET RACING CARS

State Agent is Fitting up Chevrolet and Monroe Cars for County Fair Racing.

William Small, of Indianapolis, state distributor of the Chevrolet and the Monroe roadster, has jumped into the racing game as a backer of race drivers. Small's protegee is Bill Doughty of Bluffton, a driver of experience on the dirt tracks, a sport that is getting popular in the county fairs of Indiana, Ohio, Illinois and Michigan.

Doughty has been driving a Buick racer, and in that racer made his reputation as a dirt track pilot. His wins stamp him as a driver of daring, though he is always careful, and uses his head to good advantage.

Small is having fitted up for Doughty a Chevrolet and Monroe at the factories at Flint, for the purpose of hitting the dirt track circuits in Indiana and contiguous states.

"Doughty made a big reputation in his class with his Buick racer," said Small, "but has jumped to the Chevrolet because of the speed possibilities shown him with the car made over into a machine. He will be able to go ninety miles an hour in his new car. Because of the construction of the Chevrolet, he will be able to make speed in going around the turns.

"Doughty is a mighty good driver, though he has not yet made his national reputation. He hopes to enter the big races, such as the 500-mile speedway event, but this year will stick to the dirt track stuff."
