Wins \$35,000 International Sweepstakes by Remarkable Exhibition of Speed at Sheepshead Course

One Spurt at 140 Miles

Breaks Chevrolet's '17 Record; Mulford Starts Well, but Tire Puts Him Out

Sixty thousand people saw Ralph De Palma shatter al world's records at the Sheepshead Bay Speedway yesterday when he drove his Packard racing car fifty miles at an average speed of 113 miles an hour, in the \$35,000 international sweepstakes.

Louis Chevrolet in a Frontense special burnt out a valve in the first race and was unable to appear in the following contests.
