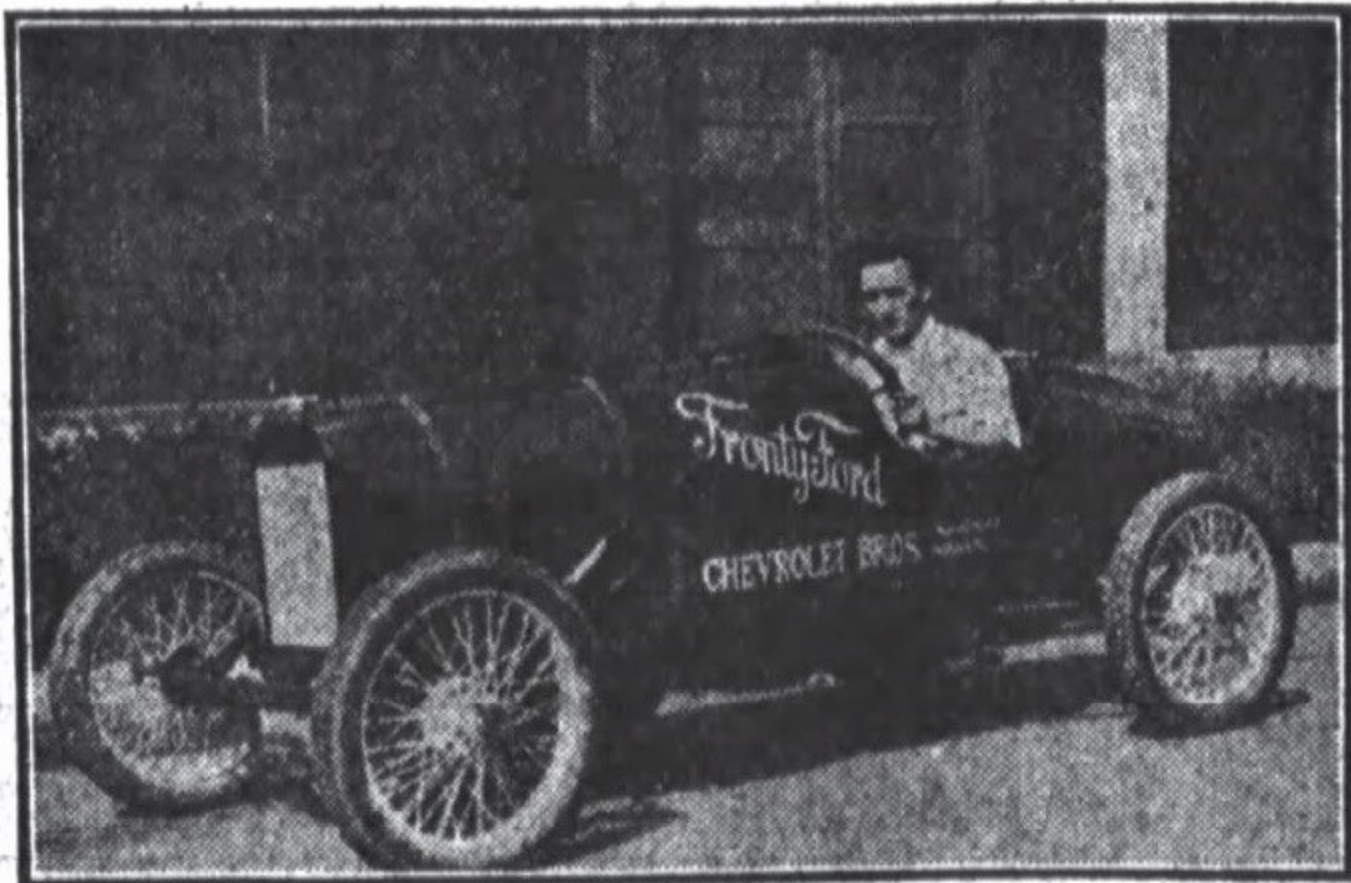


Three Fronty-Fords Are Entered In Auto Races at Centlivre Park



One of the Trio of Fronty-Fords to Race Here Sunday.

Three speedy Fronty-Fords will flash around Centlivre track next Sunday afternoon in the 10 and 50 mile races being staged by the Fort Wayne Auto Racing association. The Chevrolet Brothers company of Indianapolis is entering the cars and Arthur Chevrolet, one of the greatest of race drivers, will personally accompany the Fronty-Ford delegation. Ralph Ormsby, well known local pilot will be at the wheel of one of the cars.

On the straightaway of the Indianapolis speedway the Fronty Ford has done better than 100 miles per hour and they have done the half mile dirt track in 29 4-5 seconds which is equal to the world's record.

Other late entries include a Monroe Speedway special by the Merton & Brett company of Indianapolis, manufacturers of racing car bodies; a Chevrolet Special by Earl Warrick, Covington, Ind., a Buick special by Ray Humphrey, of Keokuk, Iowa; and a 16-valve Ford by Vetter Brothers' garage of this city.

Two silver loving cups are also to be awarded, the Fort Wayne Racing association donating one for the winner of the 50-mile race and Wayne Littlefield, the jeweler, another for the fastest time made in the elimination trials. The lap prizes to date include a phonograph by the Duesler Phonograph Shop; 10 gallons gasoline and oil, Sinclair Refining company; motometer, R. M. Kaough & Co.; magneto, Wayne Motor Service company; spotlight, Main Auto Supply company; book blocks, Hadley Furniture & Carpet company; cord tire with tube, Lomont & Co.; 10 Bosch spark plugs, Garmire Electric company; hat, Tod Hat store; 24 piston rings, Wayne Cylinder Grinding company; radiator cap and motometer, Kofte Bros.; pair driving gloves, F. H. Bohne & Bro.; 10-dollar gold piece, Wayne Electric garage; fifteen-dollar automobile robe, Service garage; 10-dollar box stationery, Becker Bros. Paper company, and spotlight, Frank Anderson.
