**Chevrolets File Incorporation Articles
for Manufacture and Sale.**

A new concern to manufacture and sell airplanes and airplane motors, to be known as the Chevrolet Aircraft Corporation, with Louis, Charles and Suzanne Chevrolet, of Indianapolis, as incorporators, has filed articles of incorporation with the secretary of state. Plans of the organization will not be completed for several months and as yet the type of motor to be manufactured has not been decided, according to Louis Chevrolet, who is associated with Arthur Chevrolet, L. J. Carlson and William F. Faust in the Chevrolet Brothers' Manufacturing Company, 410 West Tenth street. This latter company also makes airplane motors, and last summer had orders for a series of 200-pound motors of fifty to sixty-horse power for use in low-priced passenger planes.

Louis Chevrolet long has been prominent as a race driver and automobile designer. He designed machines that won the 500-mile race at the Indianapolis speedway two consecutive years. His brother Gaston, now dead, drove one of the cars to victory in 1920.
