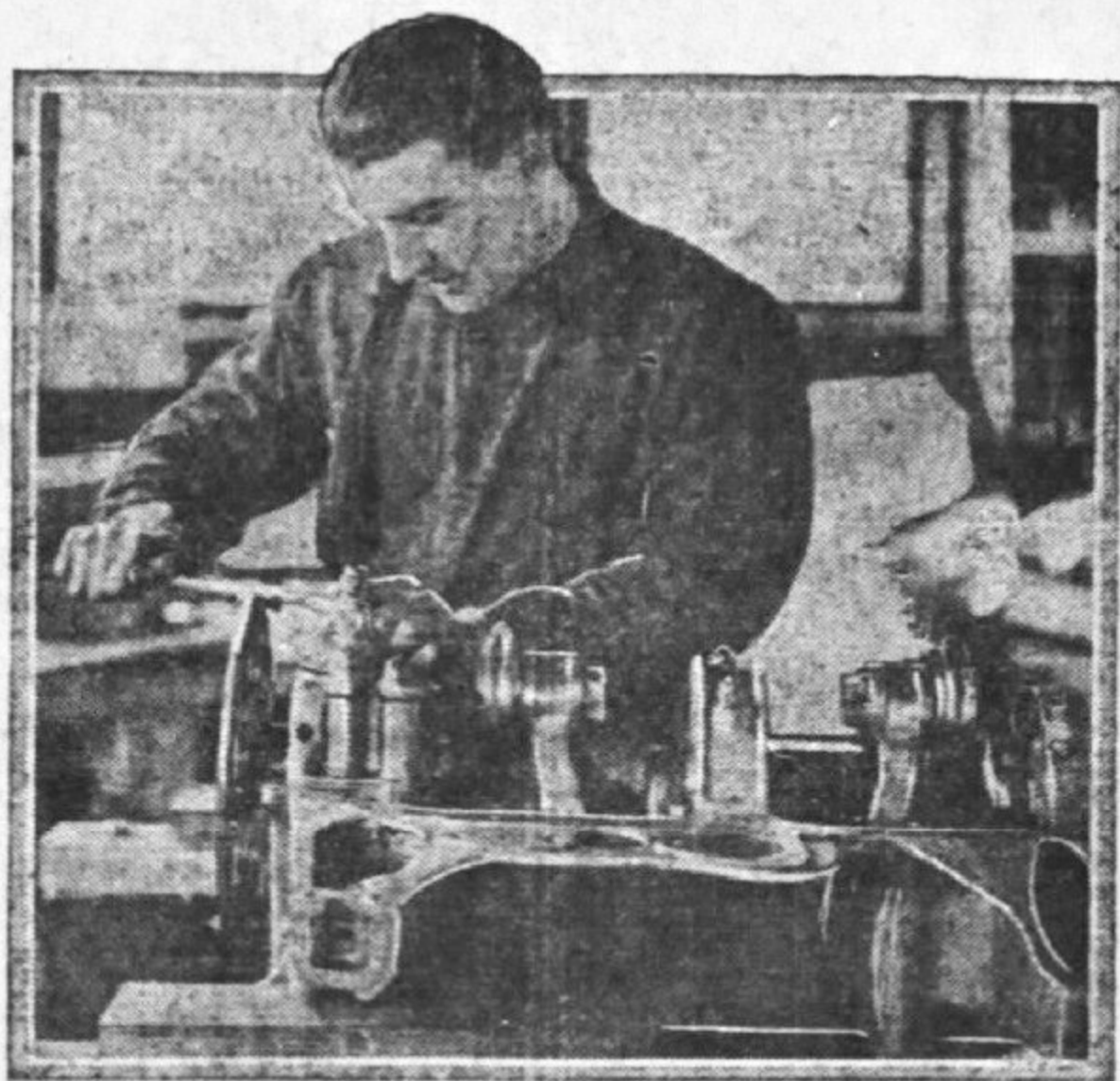


Rides Safely Through Speedway Crash

The first spill of the speedway spring training season goes to the credit of Alfred E. Moss, the English amateur racing driver who is here in Indianapolis preparing for the 500-mile race May 30. Monday afternoon, Moss was "working out" in one of Louie Chevrolet's ancient 300-inch speedsters when he blew a tire while negotiating the southeast curve which goes into the back stretch. It was at the same place that Tom Ally crashed last year. The car swerved up the track, went into a tail-spin, side-swiped the retaining wall, tearing out three sections of temporary construction which had been placed there only this spring.

Moss handled his car well, kept it upright and escaped without a scratch and with no serious injury to the car itself. Moss is in Indianapolis studying American racing motors and will drive in the May 30 race. The picture above shows him at work at one of the automobile plants of the city.
