

CHEVROLET'S 100-MILE RACE.

Frenchman Covers Distance In 2:06:00

—Mile In 0:56.

MONTGOMERY, Ala., May 4.—Louis Chevrolet of the Buick team to-day drove an exhibition mile in 56 seconds with a thirty-horse power car at the Montgomery Automobile Association meet over the Fair Grounds track. He won the 100-mile race easily in 2 hours and 6 minutes, after having tire trouble at several junctures.

George De Witt was the star of the day's meet. The Jacksonville member of the Buick team won three races, the other event of the day not being open to him.

The Alabama championship went to "Monk" Cowell, in a Chalmers-Detroit. Only drivers resident in the State were eligible for this event.

Chevrolet drove mile after mile in less than a minute in the 100-mile event, and but for trouble with tires might have set a new world's record. Robert Stubbs of Birmingham won the motor cycle events.
