

TOMMY MILTON BREEZES HOME WINNER IN TACOMA RACES

SPEEDWAY, Tacoma, July 6.—Newlywed Tommy Milton is \$10,000 richer today and his bride of a week is supremely happy. He won the 225-mile "Three A" championship auto race here yesterday after circling the 115 laps at an average speed of 95 miles an hour. Milton thundered around without making a single stop at the pits.

Fifty thousand people saw the race.

Ralph Mulford, in a Monroe, won second money, \$5,000. His trip to the pits for a tire gave Milton's Duesenberg a lead which terrific driving could not overtake.

The official scorers counted Eddie Hearne, in a Revere Special, as third; Art Klein, in a Frontenac, fourth; Roscoe Sarles, in a Monroe, fifth; Jimmie Murphy, in a Duesenberg, sixth, and Gaston Chevrolet, in a Monroe, seventh.

Chevrolet was preparing to protest these returns Tuesday. Unofficial scorers, in separated parts of the field, counted him fourth. It is possible that the official score is incorrect, and that a mix-up has done Chevrolet an injustice, and cheated him out of \$700. He wins \$1,000 in seventh place, and \$1,700 in fourth place.

Joe Thomas, Seattle pilot, drove a beautiful race until the 78th lap, when a broken piston sent him to the boneyard. He was easily running fourth place until then, and ready to forge ahead.

Cliff Durant's new \$18,000 Chevrolet was out of the race after the third lap with a broken connecting rod. And Ralph De Palma, driving a Duesenberg, was forced out with engine trouble on the 98th lap. His French Ballot could not enter because of defective connecting rods.
