LOUISVILLE SEEKS FACTORY

Of Chevrolet Aviation Motor Company, To Cost \$2,000,000.

Louisville, Ky., September 4—Possibility that Louisville will be selected as the location of a \$2,000,000 aviation motor factory was announced by Thomas Graham, of E. W. Hayes & Co., brokers.

The plant will be operated by the Arthur Chevrolet Aviation Motor Company, which recently developed two new aviation motors, one of which, a six-cylinder type, won the fifty-mile race for airplanes of 510 cubic centimeter piston displacement at the National Air Races in Cleveland Monday.

The other engine, a four-cylinder type, now is in Washington being tested by the Department of Commerce. Arthur Chevrolet, head of the company, also is there, Mr. Graham said.

On Mr. Chevrolet's return to Indianapolis, where the company now has its headquarters, the Directors are to meet and decide whether Louisville will obtain the plant. He is not expected to go back to Indianapolis before two or three weeks.

Stockholders here are making a determined effort to have the plant located here. Louisville Directors of the Arthur Chevrolet Aviation Motor Company, aside from Mr. Graham, are Major Cragie Kragenbihl and Alex. Robinson, of J. C. Willson & Co., a Louisville financial firm.
