
Toledo Winner to Race at Hoosier Track



Wilbur Shaw, Indianapolis dirt track racer, who won the 100-mile race at Toledo, June 15, will endeavor to repeat that performance at the Hoosier motor speedway, Pendleton pike and Thirty-eighth street, the afternoon of July 4. Shaw ranks high among the boys who ride with death at their elbow on the half-mile circuits of the country. His mount will be a Fronty-Ford. Shaw came into prominence last fall by winning the Dhernback trophy, for light cars, at Chicago.

The race at the local dirt course is the first of the season's efforts. There is some talk of holding

paces once a month, but no definite decision has been arrived at regarding the matter.

Some of Shaw's most formidable competition is expected to be the two Frontenac entries of H. E. Henley, of Chicago. These are the two 183-inch Frontenacs which Chance Kinsley and Herbert Jones raced at the Ascot track on the west coast last winter.

Joe Huff, also of Indianapolis, is building up two new cars to be known as Huff Specials. They will be equipped with sixteen-valve Fronty heads, but in other respects will embody the ideas that Huff

has gained in his years of racing on the half-mile tracks.
