New Home of H. E. Kindt & Son



Increasing their business to such an extent that the former location at \$10-12 Washington street proved inadequate to handle the ever increasing sales, H. E. Kindt & Son have taken over the new salesroom at 712-18 North Seventh street, and in addition to the new location will retain the former site on Washington street as a modern paint and repair shop.

Mr. Kindt, who has been a resident of Allentown for the past twenty-five years, started in a modest way the sale of rebuilt cars back in 1917, doing so against the advice of experienced automobile dealers who said that the business would not be a paying one. He rented the store-room at 610-12 Washington street from Fred Gernerd, and his new venture proved so successful that a year later he was able to purchase the place outright from Mr. Gernerd.

In 1920 the Kindt firm suffered an unexpected setback through accident, when a storm caved in the roof of the building, doing considerable damage. However, the roof was restored, and, in addition, a second story added to the building.

Last year Mr. Kindt purchased from the Ruhe Motor Car Company the site at 712-18 North Seventh street, and now takes over this establishment as the salesroom, the building measuring 77 by 120 feet. In addition, the old building on Washington street, measuring 40 by 120 feet and two stories high, is retained.

The Kindt firm conducts a rebuilt car sales service, buying most of its cars from dealers. The automobiles are torn apart, completely rebuilt and repainted, with all the qualities of a new car. The sales of rebuilt cars increase daily, the public in general realizing that the Kindt firm is giving real service to its patrons.
