AUTOMOBILE PLANT READY IN A MONTH

American Motor Corporation Rushing Front Street Factory to Completion.

Work on the plant of the American Motor Coroporation, on West Front street, has progressed so far that officials of the concern expect that the plant will be ready for use in one month's time. The main building, 60x200 feet in length, is now nearing completion. It will be modern in every way and fireproof. Other buildings of cimilar construction will be erected as soon as the company starts on a working basis.

The administration building is now ready for use, and in a lew days work will be started on grading the ground. By spring it is expected that there will be 200 men working at the plant, and this number will be increased all the time as the business increases.

The concern will make the American Six, a car that, it is said, will rank with the foremost machines. will have a six-cylinder engine, with the cylinders cast singly, and will have a 122-inch wheel base. The car was designed by Louis Chevrolet, president of the Chevrolet Automobile Corporation. The construction work will be under the supervision of John C. Spiers, who has been connected with some of the most prominent automobile concerns in the country in a like capacity.
