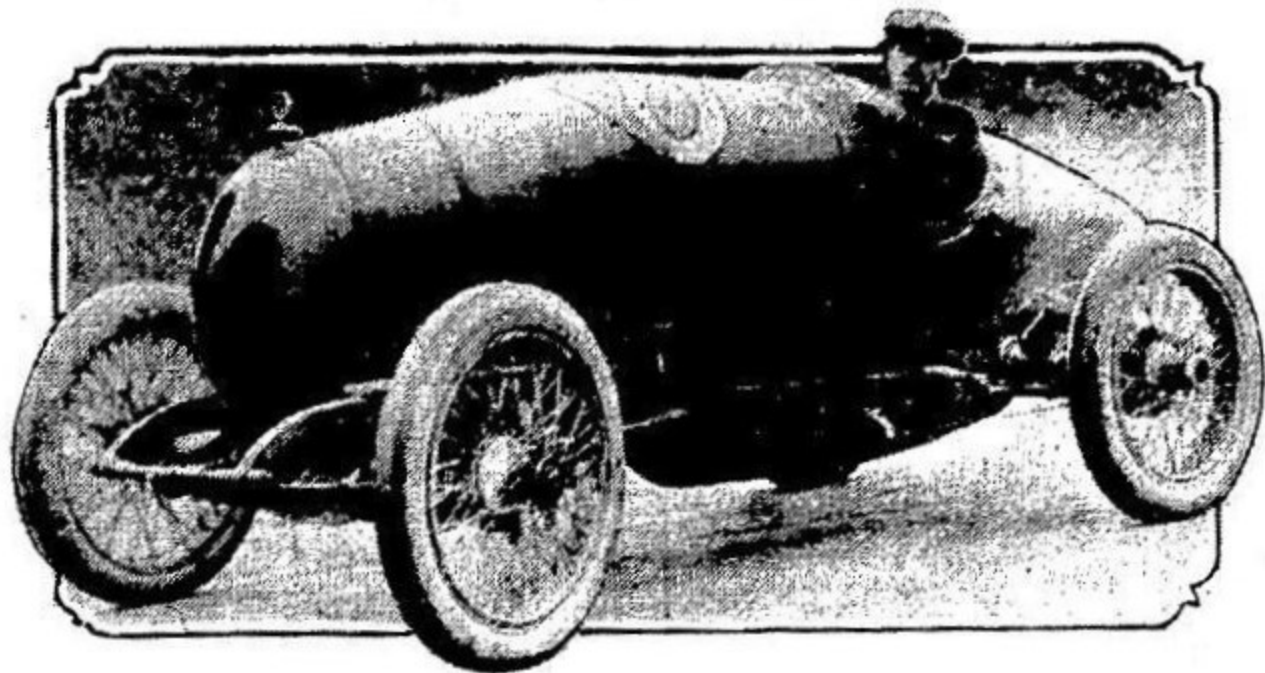


Former Syracusan Will Drive Car in Today's Races
